"The production of natural resources is crippled...Business is suffering; places of amusement, schools, even the churches are closed in many and large sections, and the fear of death is tormenting many." These words may sound like they were spoken recently by someone in our community, but they actually appeared in *The Lutheran Witness* of **October 29, 1918**, from an

article titled, "The Epidemic," by Pastor Richard Jesse

Devastating diseases have been a part of our world since the fall of human beings into sin. The current COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted our lives and thrown our ordinary routines into complete chaos. So how has the church reacted in the past, and how should we react today?

If we go back to 1793, history shows that there was an epidemic of yellow fever that broke out in Philadelphia. People struggled to figure out the best ways to protect themselves. Pastor J.H.C. Helmuth continued to hold worship services during the outbreak, which may have increased the death toll among his congregation as 641 people from his Lutheran church died.

In 1918, when the Spanish flu hit the United States, one of the hardest hit cities was Philadelphia, which did little to stop the impact of the flu. Other cities did address the problem, including cancelling public worship services – known as "Churchless Sundays." During this time it was customary among Lutherans to have family worship at home as parents read the Scripture readings for the day.

In the midst of the pandemic, there was a lot of uncertainty and fear as Pastor Helmuth wrote in his journal: "The sickness and death are all around us. Lord Jesus, help us. Do not leave us alone." Jesus did not abandon His people then and He will never abandon us today.




While cancelling public worship services was very difficult for me to do back in March, obviously it had been done in the past during a pandemic. While I certainly thought things would be better by now, I know God is still with us and He will never leave us. In fact, this virus did not surprise God. He knew it was coming and fortunately, He allowed it to come when we had the technology to record and stream our worship services so families could see them and worship together at home.

We are doing everything we can to open our facility to public worship once again. Ideally we would like to have public worship services again on the first weekend of August, but we will let you know when we have set a definite date. In the meantime, I invite you to continue to worship with us on Facebook and YouTube and to consider ways you can show others the love of God during these challenging days.

You Can Stop Public Worship, But You Can't Stop The Church

One of the things that I have always enjoyed about our church facility is that it is a place that is used seven days a week. While this pandemic has prevented us from using the facility for all of our different ministries, it hasn't stopped our ministries. In fact, while we are going through an incredible challenge right now, I believe God doesn't want us to just get through this crisis. I believe He wants us to thrive, maybe even start new ministries during these challenging days.

In order for our ministries to continue and even thrive, I wanted to make you aware that several of our expenses have increased dramatically. Such as:



1) Soap, Paper Towels, Mops, & Bleach. While we have fewer children at our child development center this year as compared to last year, we are using more cleaning supplies every day. Plus, we have to purchase more expensive cleaning supplies that are designed to protect against the coronavirus.

2) Hand Sanitizer and Thermometers. These items are needed whenever a person enters the building. They will also be used when we open again for public worship services.



3) **Zoom Subscription**. In order to teach our students and have meetings with our church leaders, "Zoom" has become a necessary tool in our ministries.

4) Live Streaming Equipment. A camera was installed in the sanctuary and additional equipment was necessary to record and stream our worship services.

We are thankful to God for his many blessings. After many months (actually years) of work and countless delays we are finally receiving our CO (Certificate of Occupancy) for our new Education Building. We can now occupy it and use it. There is still some clean-up to be finished, but that should be done in the next week or so. The retention pond is undergoing a few updates to satisfy all of the codes and inspections. We have a small amount of mulch to finish, but these are all small touch-up items. Kitchen appliances are installed and ready for use. Additional tables and chairs for our Fellowship Hall will now be ordered.

The big question is: How and when can we use our new facilities because of the restrictions placed on us as a result of the COVID-19 virus. The Youth will be able to occupy their new space immediately. The CDC will also be able to move from their temporary overflow space in the Narthex, Library etc. to the Education Building. The Finance team can move into their new office and vacate their previous space in the Library. These are some of the immediate uses, but the timing of most of the future use that involves larger groups of people will be determined by the COVID-19 restrictions.

This will likely be the last report from the Building Committee since that phase of our expansion is complete.
