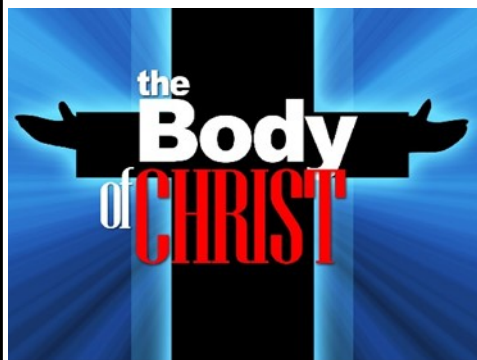
"The Body of Christ"



Have you ever thought about the body of Christ – His feet, hands, mouth, ears, eyes, and heart? The Bible tells us that a woman one day poured perfume on Jesus' feet and wiped His feet with her hair. What do you think His feet looked like, knowing that Jesus had to walk everywhere in sandals? What about Jesus' hands? I would guess they were a combination of strength and gentleness. They were hands that loved to touch people as well as provide protection. We probably don't think a lot about Jesus' mouth, but the words that came from His mouth still bring life and forgiveness. The ears and eyes of Christ certainly heard and saw many wonderful things, but His ears also heard the shouts of "Crucify Him," and His eyes saw the anger and hatred of people as He closed them in death.

Scripture tells us quite a bit about the body of Christ and during our midweek Lenten worship services we will focus on a different part of Jesus' body each week as we consider what Jesus' body had to endure in order to save each one of us.

The season of Lent is a time when, through a period of 40 days, we remember Jesus' journey to the cross. By setting aside a special 40-day period to reflect on our lives through prayer and worship, we imitate Jesus' withdrawal into the wilderness for 40 days after He was baptized. Therefore, we offer additional worship services during Lent on Wednesday nights at **7:00pm** and I invite you to join us for the following services:



March 2: "The Feet of Christ" – Luke 7:36-50

March 9: "The Hands of Christ" – John 8:1-11

March 16: "The Mouth of Christ" – Luke 4:12-22a

March 23: "The Ears of Christ" – Mark 7:31-37

March 30: "The Eyes of Christ" – John 9:1-11

April 6: "The Heart of Christ" – John 11:17-44

April 14: "The Blood of Christ" – John 13:1-20

April 15: "The Body of Christ" – John 19:16-42

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2, when ashes are placed on our foreheads to remind us of our sin, but those ashes are also placed in the shape of a cross to remind us that we are forgiven. We will have two worship services on Ash Wednesday, 5:00pm & 7:00pm. Please note that ashes will be placed on people's foreheads using a brush or Q-tip applicator, just like last year, in order to avoid physical contact with people.

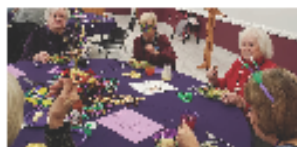

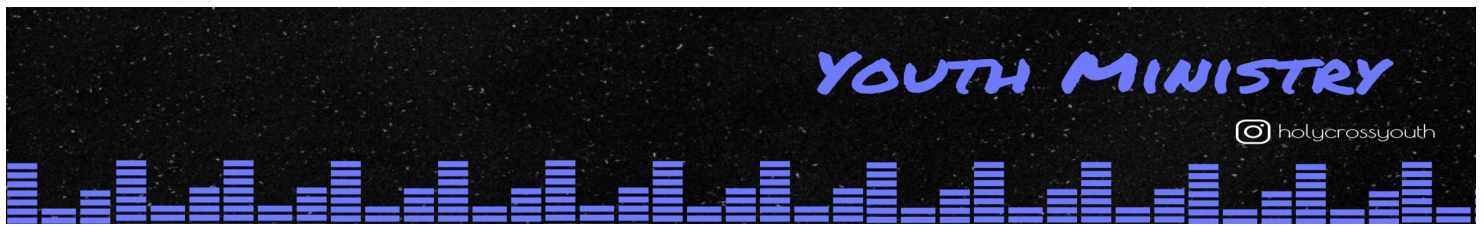
